OFFICER PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES



SUBJECT	SECTION
OUTPOST SCOUTS	OUTPOST FCF STAFF

POSITION

1. The Outpost Scout is a member of the Outpost staff.
2. He reports to the Outpost Coordinator.
3. The Outpost Scout is appointed by the Outpost Council.
4. His term of office shall be 1 year.
5. He is recommended by his Outpost Commander, and should complete the Junior Leadership Foundations interview with his Outpost Commander and Outpost FCF Representative
6. The Outpost Scout will wear the Outpost Scout patch on his uniform indicating his position.
7. Each Outpost will have two (2) Outpost Scouts- one for Adventure Rangers, one for Expedition Rangers.

QUALIFICATIONS

1. He must be a born again Christian and should be filled with the Holy Spirit.
2. Regularly wear his Royal Rangers uniform to outpost meetings.
3. He must demonstrate an upstanding reputation and a willingness to serve the outpost in an enthusiastic and responsible manner.
4. He must be at least Adventure Ranger age but under the age of 18 at time of appointment.
5. He must be active in a local outpost.
6. He must be willing to assist other Rangers in his outpost in completion of Trail of the Grizzly merits and FCF advancement.
7. He must be able to attend Outpost staff meetings and events throughout his term.
8. He must practice and become proficient in all Frontier skills and knowledgeable of FCF safety rules and regulations.
9. He should be working to achieve Buckskin and ultimately Wilderness status.

DUTIES

The Outpost Scout is appointed to provide leadership among other boys in FCF within his outpost. He is also tasked with providing a boys perspective of FCF to the adult leadership. His responsibilities include the following:

1. Assist the Outpost FCF Rep. in planning, organizing and conducting FCF events for his outpost.
2. Learn from Outpost leadership and accept responsibilities as assigned.
3. Serve as a role model for other boys by living by the Royal Rangers Code.
4. Attend periodic planning and information meetings with the Section Scout and the Section FCF Rep. The purpose of these meetings is to encourage and promote membership within the local outposts, assist others in earning Trail of the Grizzly merits, FCF advancement and encourage attendance at FCF events.
5. Maintain correspondence with the Section and Chapter Scouts.
6. Acquire and maintain an FCF outfit and wear his outfit (or outfits) at all events.
7. Attend as many district FCF sponsored events as possible, and strive to attend Territorial and National Rendezvous.
8. Attend Sectional Roundtable meetings.
9. Assist in the planning and conducting of FCF events.
