Sectional / Outpost Scout Selection Procedures

1. Outpost Scouts

Each outpost should select two Outpost Scouts from the available FCF Young Buck membership within the outpost, one from the Adventure Rangers outpost, and one from the Expedition Rangers outpost.

Young men who would be interested in serving in this position should notify their Outpost Commander, who will notify the Outpost Coordinator. The Outpost Coordinator in consultation with the Outpost Committee should then review the request from each boy and make an appointment using the minimum standard found in the Royal Rangers Leaders Manual: Inspire the Journey pg. 275.

The Outpost Commander and Outpost FCF Representative will conduct the Junior Leadership Foundations interview with the new scout, and should give a copy of the outpost scout job description. The appointment should be publicly announced at a council of achievement or other appropriate event.

The appointment shall be for one year, and he may only succeed himself one time.

2. Sectional Scouts

Any boy from within the section may be elected as a Sectional Scout. They do not need to be serving as an Outpost Scout to run for a Sectional Scout position.

Young Bucks who are interested in serving as a sectional scout should review the Sectional Scout job description.

Sectional Scout candidates should fill out the FCF Scout Application and forward it to the Sectional FCF Representative prior to the date of elections.

The scout elections can be held at the following events:

- Section FCF work nights
- Chapter FCF Trace
- Sectional Camporee

The election should be held when the greatest number of FCF members will be present at an event.

The election should allow for each boy to explain why he would like to serve as the sectional scout, and then the membership should vote by secret ballot for the candidate they choose.

The secret ballot should be a slip of paper with the boys name written on it and counted. A show of hands will not be acceptable.

The boy with the highest number of votes becomes the scout, and the one with the second highest votes becomes the assistant. Their term of office is for one year, and he may only succeed himself one time.

Boys who are elected as sectional scouts that are serving as outpost scouts should resign the outpost position when elected.

All boys are eligible to run for Chapter Scout / Assistant Scout if they meet the requirements, and have been active FCF members for at least one year. They do not need to be already serving as a sectional scout to be considered for that position.
